Course Description:

In this course students become familiar with the aesthetics of Japanese Fine Arts and Performing Arts by studying objects and performances related to their social and historical background. The course gives a panoramic view of Japanese Art and Music from the 7th to the 20th centuries. The weight of this course is put on interaction and on direct contact with the arts. Teams for student presentations on a specific art topic will be organized. An excursion to a theatre performance and viewings from Guignard's private art collection is planned.

The teacher provides hand-outs for each class.

Evaluation

The grade will be given based on team-presentations (30%) and a final exam (70%). No previous knowledge about Japanese culture or history is required. Evaluation method may change at the instructor's discretion depending on the class size and other factors.
